Ideally four basketball courts in size with bathroom, change rooms, showers and meeting rooms. Wheelchair access and ground level vehicle access for delivery of fencing-specific equipment.
ACT Gymnastics Association Inc	1	WODEN VALLEY GYMNASTICS FACILITIES	The Woden valley Gymnastics Club needs an additional gymnastics facility. The gym has operated at maximum capacity for a number of years, with inadequate floor space, reducing waiting lists for programs such as Kindergym, Inclusion and Recreational programs. This problem is likely to become more acute with the projected growth of the nearby Molonglo Valley suburbs.
	2	SOUTHERN CANBERRA GYMNASTICS SPECTATOR SEATING	Addition of a mezzanine extension to Southern Canberra gymnastics to enable spectators.
	3	CANBERRA CITY GYMNASTICS EXTENSION	Extend and create a larger and fit for purpose gymnastics facility.
	4	AIS ARENA GYMNASTICS	Re-establish floor anchors in the AIS arena floor for Gymnastics events and obtain the equipment needed to hold large scale multi gym sport events.

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	5	CANBERRA TRAMPOLINE FACILITY	Build a fit for purpose facility for trampoline gym sports in the ACT.

This will restore their structural integrity, ensure safety for all users, and enhance the overall operational efficiency of the club.
	4	RESURFACING AND DRAINAGE WORKS FOR BOATSHED/PUBLIC TOILET FORECOURT AND ACCESS ROAD	Resurfacing of the carpark and access road, including drainage works.
	5	PATHWAY TO CONNECT DOCK, BEACHES AND JUDGES TOWER	Construction of a concrete path along the riverside adjacent to the barbecue area, serving as a crucial link within the Waterski Club. This path will establish a firm, accessible connection between the dock area, spanning from the boat ramp to Sylvia Curley Bridge, and the three beach areas, culminating at the judges' tower offering improved accessibility and safety to our members and visitors. Part of this construction work will involve significant landscaping along the riverbank.

	3	NEW PAVILION AND CHANGE FACILITIES	New pavilion and change facilities including social and community rooms; office and administration; under cover external viewing (including tiered seating); umpire facilities; public toilets; canteen; male and female facilities to the design guidelines of 'Local Facilities' as set out in the AFL design guide.

	2	SHADE FOR WVAC SHOOTING LINE	Install 10 x 24sqm shade structures along the shooting line with rain water management, eg guttering leading to gravel 'soaker pits'.

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	3	CONCRETE PATHS, SHOOTING LINE AND WAITING LINE AT WVAC	Concrete the Shooting Line (approx 165 sqm); install concrete paths leading from the facilities to the shooting area (approx 70sqm); and concrete the waiting line (under the shade structures) (approx 330 sqm). Dig down prior to concreting to have it flush with current ground level so that it doesn't create a 'dam' because water drains towards the shooting line. Relocate dirt on site to level areas or create a back stop at the end of range etc.

	5	SHADE FOR WVAC COMMUNAL AREAS	Install shade sails for communal areas around the WVAC buildings providing shade for people while setting up equipment, maintaining equipment, waiting for family members to participate and rest during breaks.
	6	WVAC STORAGE AND WORKSHOP AREA	Buy and install a building/container for a bow maintenance workshop and to have target butts available to members at all times.
	7	WVAC LANDSCAPING AND FIXTURES FOR PARTICIPANT AMENITY	Landscaping and furniture installation works for improved site/participant amenity. Eg garden beds, plantings, benches etc.

AusCycling	1	ACT MOUNTAIN BIKE TRAIL MAINTENANCE FUND	Creation of a central fund managed by the ACT Government to provide for maintenance and support for ACT mountain bike trails. The fund would be available through a competitive bidding process to trail managers across Canberra. In the first instance, funding would prioritise urgent repair and reconstruction work to address safety issues at popular trail networks.
	2	SAFETY AND AMENITY UPGRADES AT NARRABUNDAH VELODROME	Stage 1 - construction of a new apron and in-field design, realignment of safety fences and gates, and resurfacing of the velodrome track to provide for basic safety requirements for the ongoing use of the velodrome. Stage 2 - upgrades to the toilets, creation of club rooms and storage, and provision of lighting.
	3	CRITERIUM TRACK LIGHTING AT STROMLO FOREST PARK	Installation of lighting at the criterium track to allow racing, training and community use after dark, particularly outside of daylight savings periods.

The cyclocross course would benefit from a set of basic cyclocross obstacles such as stairs, barriers and sand pits.

The dirt jumps would provide a progressive facility suited to intermediate and advanced riders and suitable for hosting major events and competitions. The dirt jumps would be supplemented with basic supporting amenities, including a shade structure and storage.

Basketball ACT	1	BELCONNEN BASKETBALL STADIUM EXPANSION	Belconnen Stadium would grow from four to eight courts. Basketball ACT owns the land on which the current stadium stands, and adjoining land (Block 16 Belconnen) which is now considered shovel-ready and appropriately zoned to build indoor sporting facilities. The current stadium occupies the entirety of usable land on block 13 Belconnen, the adjoining land provides a unique expansion opportunity that Basketball ACT is seeking support to develop as the sport is now at an impasse.

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	2	WODEN MULTI SPORT INDOOR STADIUM	A multisport indoor stadium consisting of 4-6 indoor courts to be built within the Woden region.

	3	LIGHTS FOR CARPARK	Lighting for the Molonglo Reach carpark.
	4	ADDITIONAL SHED SPACE	The proposed additional space will be built onto the rear of the shed, using the same cladding and roof line as the current building so that the visual impact remains minimal. It will house the club tinnie and trailer, thereby freeing up space in the current shed for the expansion of club activities such as gym and indoors technique sessions.
	5	PONTOON ALONGSIDE BANK	Pontoon alongside the bank at Molonglo Reach, similar to ones at Black Mountain peninsula to allow safer access to the water for lake users and enhance our standard for hosting Canoe Polo competitions.
	6	FLOODLIGHTS TO FACILITATE TWILIGHT RACING	Purchase of 8 floating floodlights to light up a 1 km circuit on the Molonglo River off the beach area and including the canoe polo playing fields; installation of 3 permanent remote operated floodlights on the north bank of the Molonglo River to allow night-time canoe polo games and flatwater marathon racing. The lights will light up the area between the existing pontoons and the beach.
	7	PERMANENT FLATWATER SLALOM COURSE	Develop a permanent flatwater slalom course (to support the development of ACT athletes for the Brisbane Olympic in 2030 and World Championships) on a local waterway.
